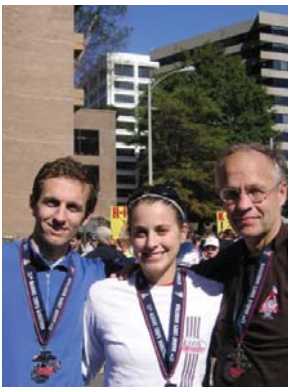
## 1980
