The Return of Ryan McWilliams

Ryan McWilliams, Class of 2002, is back at Saint George's this fall, but now as a teacher. After earning his B.A. from Stanford, Ryan is leading the Upper School American Literature, Elements of English, and Debate classes.

"I was inspired to be a teacher by people like Errol Schmidt, Deena Barber, and Chad Rigsby," says Ryan. "Knowing that I could be a colleague with them was a big reason for wanting to come back."

In fact Ryan teaches the Debate classes with Chad and serves as his Assistant Debate Coach. "I'd wished we had debate when I was here, so it's a highlight to restart the program," he says. One of their two-man teams won the first novice tournament they entered, out-talking

over 20 teams from throughout Spokane and Coeur d'Alene, while two Saint George's students earned Individual Speaker awards.
