



Saint George's International Students

Saint George's School provides a rigorous, stimulating college preparatory education for non-native English speakers. International students enter Saint George's possessing the talent and preparation to further their academics while increasing their proficiency with the English language. Committed to excellence, Saint George's School challenges International students to develop their intellectual, artistic creative and athletic potential. We engage our International students, from their first day forward, in activities that welcome them into a community of peers preparing to be lifelong learners, responsible members of the school community and beyond, and informed citizens of the world.

Saint George's School International Program:

An International student is defined as a non-native English speaking student whose parents reside outside the US. Saint George's will consider an International student for admission entering at all grades provided they meet the individual division requirements. International students study in all mainstream classes.

Requirements:

Lower School – Grades one through five:

- Students must live with parent while in the US attending Saint George's School.
- Age appropriately speak, read and comprehend with proficiency the foreign language taught in the LS
- Possess a working knowledge of the English language
- Complete the admission process including placement testing either in English or the foreign language taught in the Lower School.

– or –

- Students must live with parent while in the US attending Saint George's School
- Age appropriately speak, read and comprehend with proficiency the English language.
- Complete the admission process including placement testing in English

Middle School – Grades six through seven:

- Students must live with parent while in the US attending Saint George's School
- Age appropriately speak, read and comprehend with proficiency the English language.
- Complete the admission process including placement testing in English

Upper School – Grades nine through twelve:

- Age appropriately speak and understand with proficiency the English language.
- Submit a TOFEL score of 140 computer based (460 paper) for admission to ninth grade, 173 (500) for tenth grade, and 213 (550) for eleventh grade.

Note: English as a Second Language (ESL) courses are not offered at SGS. International students are financially responsible for their tutoring.

Finances:

Families of International students residing outside the United States are charged full tuition and a yearly international student fee. Tuition must be paid in full prior to the first day of classes. Tuition payment options A & B are offered to families of reenrolling International students.

Families of non-native English speaking students who reside in the United States are eligible to apply for tuition assistance dependent upon meeting all tuition assistance requirements. The yearly international student fee is not applicable.

Accommodations:

International students and their families are responsible for securing their own yearly accommodations. Compensation to host families is negotiated and agreed upon between the host family and the international student's family.

Health and Insurance:

International students must provide the school with a certificate of immunization and declaration of medical insurance. Medical insurance information is provided by the admission office or by contacting the following providers.
